Admissions Criteria

Exceptions to these admission criteria may be applied. Every application is reviewed by the College. To be eligible for acceptance into an ACS program, applicants are generally required to meet one of the following criteria:

- Have obtained a Secondary School Diploma (SSD).
- Have obtained a Diploma of Vocational Studies (DVS) and have successfully completed the following prerequisite courses:
 - French at the Secondary 5 level;
 - English at the Secondary 5 level;
 - Mathematics CST Grade 4 (Math 436 under the former curriculum).
- Have obtained training deemed equivalent or sufficient by LaSalle College.
