Purpose	The policy aims to establish the principles of assessment for student work within the provided Higher Education units delivered at LCI Melbourne (LCIM).		
Scope	The policy applies to all accredited units offered and to all Academic staff and students.		
Policy Statement	LCIM defines and develops learning outcomes and assessment criteria to confirm students' achievements and success at particular higher education award levels as specified by sector standards and the Australian Oualifications Framework (AQF). Assessments are designed to measure student performance against unit learning outcomes, to promote learning, achieve graduate outcomes, and enhance student attributes.  LCIM sees learning and assessment as part of an ongoing feedback process. The		
	assessment provides information on learning that has taken place in order to foster and further develop future learning.		
Policy Strategies	LCI Melbourne's approach to assessment is informed by the <u>Higher Education</u> <u>Standards Framework (Threshold Standards) 2021</u> made under section 58(1) of the Tertiary Education Quality and Standards Agency Act 2011.  The strategy and principles of assessment at LCI Melbourne include that:		
	Standards of performance should be described for assessment tasksin sufficient detail as outlined in the Assessment Guide document		
	Standards should be defined in the context of the unit and at an appropriate AQF level		
	Assessment standards should be benchmarked against field of education and professional industry standards with internal and external benchmarking procedures		
	Assessment methods and criteria are based on Academic achievement aligned to specific unit and program learning outcomes for each qualification		
	5 Assessment methods include the provision of formative and constructive feedback in a timely manner for students to measure and track their progress against the learning outcomes		
	6 Assessments should be fair, equitable and objective		
	Assessments should be moderated using appropriate moderation techniques to ensure parity across units and AQF level		

	8 Moderation should furthermore include academic staff peer toensure tasks are appropriate for unit learning outcomes				
	Students should have the opportunity for formative and summative learning experiences that are used to determine grades. This may include student peer review, student self-review and external industry critique panels.
