Purpose	This procedure outlines the processes LCI Melbourne uses to uphold academic integrity, in alignment with the Academic Integrity Policy and relevant regulatory frameworks including the Higher Education Standards Framework (2021) and TEQSA's Academic and Research Integrity Guidance Note (2024).
Scope	This procedure applies to all students, academic staff, and third-party providers involved in academic and research activity at LCI Melbourne.
Procedures	<p>1. Academic Integrity Education and Support</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Students receive training on academic integrity in their first trimester, including referencing, use of generative AI, and expectations around plagiarism and collusion. ▪ Staff are inducted into academic integrity processes upon appointment, including training on ethical assessment design and reporting procedures. ▪ Resources and guidelines are accessible via the LMS and reinforced through academic skills workshops. <p>2. Preventing Academic Misconduct</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ All assessment design must embed preventative strategies that promote authentic and ethical learning. ▪ Heads of Faculty monitor assessment integrity within their programs. ▪ Use of AI must follow the Acceptable Use of Artificial Intelligence Policy. Breaches may constitute misconduct. <p>3. Suspected Student Misconduct</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Step 1 – Initial Discussion: If misconduct is suspected, the Academic Mentor discusses concerns with the student and documents outcomes. ▪ Step 2 – Escalation to Head of Faculty: If concerns persist, the Academic Mentor submits evidence to the Head of Faculty for review and determination. ▪ Step 3 – Determining Outcomes: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. First Offence: May result in a zero for the task and a formal warning. 2. Second Offence: May result in a zero for the unit. 3. Third Offence: May result in suspension or exclusion, determined by the Director of Studies in consultation with the Academic Integrity Panel. <p>All outcomes are documented in the student file and reported to the</p>

	<p>Academic Operations Manager.</p> <p>4. Suspected Staff Misconduct</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Concerns are referred to the Director of Studies and investigated by an Academic Integrity Panel. Outcomes may include a formal warning, removal from teaching duties, or termination, in line with the Educational Services Award and Fair Work Australia provisions. <p>5. Confidentiality and Record Keeping</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> All academic integrity matters are treated confidentially. Records are maintained securely and retained in accordance with LCIM's Records Management Policy. <p>6. Appeals</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Students or staff may appeal decisions using the Academic Grievance and Appeals Procedure within 10 working days of receiving the outcome. Appeals are reviewed by an independent panel appointed by the Director of Studies. Appeal decisions are final and communicated in writing.
