## HOW TO APPLY

- Online application form, completed with \$150 payment<sup>1</sup>
- Admissions interview (in-person, online or by phone)
- A completed and signed enrollment agreement
- Proof of secondary school graduation or equivalent<sup>2</sup>
- A copy of government issued identification
- Essay<sup>3</sup>
- Portfolio<sup>4</sup>

<sup>1</sup> \$100 Application fee will be refunded to the applicant if they are not accepted.

<sup>2</sup> High School graduation may also be satisfied with GED, Mature Status (Accuplacer Test may be required).

<sup>3</sup> Degree programs except Associate of Arts degree are required an essay. Minimum of 500 words for the Bachelor of Design in Fashion Design and minimum of 250 words for other degree programs.

<sup>4</sup> Bachelor of Design in Fashion Design requires a portfolio. Please contact your admissions representative for information.

<sup>5</sup> If students do not have a valid permit, they need to obtain a study permit before starting the program and provide a copy to LCV. E-learning programs do not require a study permit.

## INTERNATIONAL

International applicants must meet the requirements under "How to Apply", plus:

- A photocopy of valid passport
- A photocopy of a valid study permit<sup>5</sup>
- Proof of secondary school graduation in English including official translation
- Proof of English proficiency

## MATH

Math is required for students enrolling in all Degree programs and the Visual and Game Programming Diploma program.

- 68 percent in Math 11 (or equivalent)
- Accuplacer Placement Test

## The language of instruction at LaSalle College Vancouver is English. Applicants can demonstrate their English language competency in one of the following ways:

1. Achieve minimum scores on tests of English proficiency as described in the English Language Proficiency table on next page.
2. For degree applicants, achieve a grade of 68 percent in any one of: BC English 12, English Literature 12, English 12 First Peoples, Communications 12 or Technical and Professional Communications 12 or equivalent in another high school system. For diploma applicants, achieve a grade of 55 percent in any one of: BC English 12, English Literature 12, English 12 First Peoples, Communications 12 or Technical and Professional Communications 12 or equivalent in another high school system. Equivalencies can only be determined by the Chief Academic Officer.
3. Advanced Placement (AP) English Language or English Literature, minimum grade of 3 or 68 percent.
4. International Baccalaureate (IB) English Language A1 or A2 (Higher or Standard level), minimum grade of 5 or better.
5. Proof of undergraduate or higher degree conferral from a recognized post-secondary institution where English is the language of instruction.
6. Achieve 68 percent or higher in 100-level English language course at a recognized post-secondary institution.
7. Successful completion of a minimum of two consecutive full-time academic semesters or quarters of post-secondary course work at an equivalent credential level, with a minimum overall score of 68% for degree and 55% for diploma, at a recognized college or university in which English is the language of instruction. Successful completion is defined as passing all courses for which the student was registered during the two semesters.
8. Achieve a PASS on GED administered in English.
9. 480 score or higher on the Evidence-Based Reading and Writing Section of the SAT.

All scores must have been obtained within two years of the start date of the program to be considered valid.

## LEVEL COMPLETION FROM AN ACCEPTED LANGUAGE SCHOOL

LaSalle College Vancouver has language pathway agreements with select language schools. Level completion from one of these schools may satisfy the English proficiency requirement.
